Hendricks Tile is made from reinforced concrete, in colors and textures especially selected for the individual job. It is hand-finished to achieve a unique, natural appearance. And within a year after the tile is installed, it has weathered to a warm, mellow color that sets it apart from any other roofing product. Hendricks tile is a lifetime investment. It was first made in 1926, and today covers homes, churches and restorations all up and down the east coast. From Stone Mountain Plantation in Georgia to the River Road Shopping Center in Virginia (cover photo), the tile performs well, even in adverse weather conditions. At the same time, its gradual aging gives the building a particular look of distinction—and the architect, a distinctive reputation.

Fine Grain Weathered

An accurate reproduction of an old weathered wood shingle, including a light random growth of moss. This tile is appropriate for early American or Georgian Architecture. It may be used in restoration work or whenever a roof of traditional warmth is desired.

Random widths of 6", 7", 8"
Exposure length 7½"
Butt thickness ½" to ⅝"
Weight 11 lbs. per sq. ft.
Moss effect optional

Colonial Round Butt

The practice of rounding the corners of roof shingles was a popular one among our early builders. They are used extensively today in a more durable form, to help restore prominent Colonial Architecture.

Random widths of 5", 6", 7"
Exposure length 7½"
Butt thickness ½" to ⅝"
Weight 11 lbs. per sq. ft.
Moss effect optional

Hand Split Shake Texture

The heavy rustic appearance of this tile makes it a preferred one for Western and Contemporary design.

Custom blended colors in browns, greys, reds and greens.

Random widths of 6", 7", 8"
Exposure length 7½"
Butt thickness ½" to ⅞"
Weight 13 lbs. per sq. ft.
Moss effect optional

Continental Tile

Well suited for formal Architecture of the European form such as French Provincial, English, Gothic and Spanish.

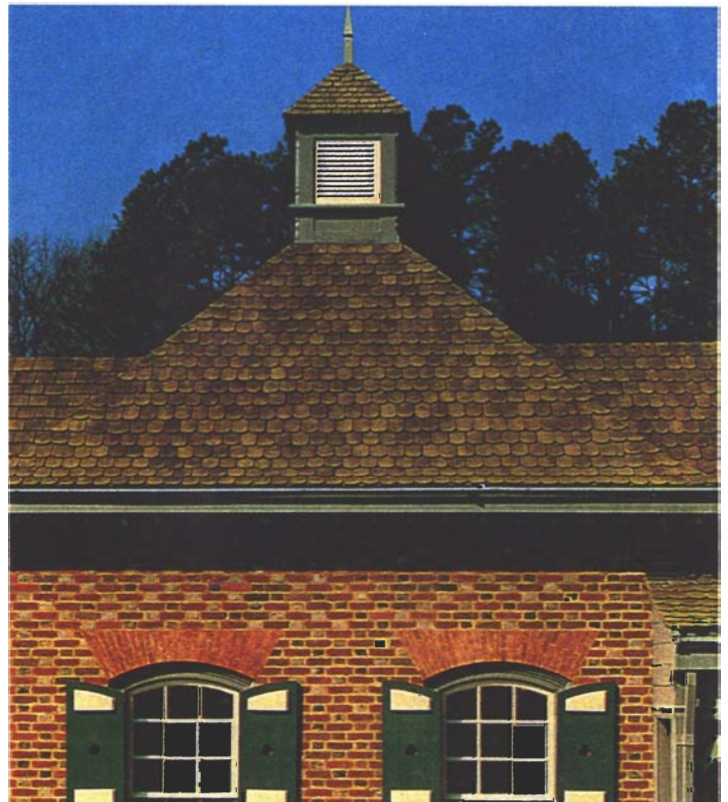

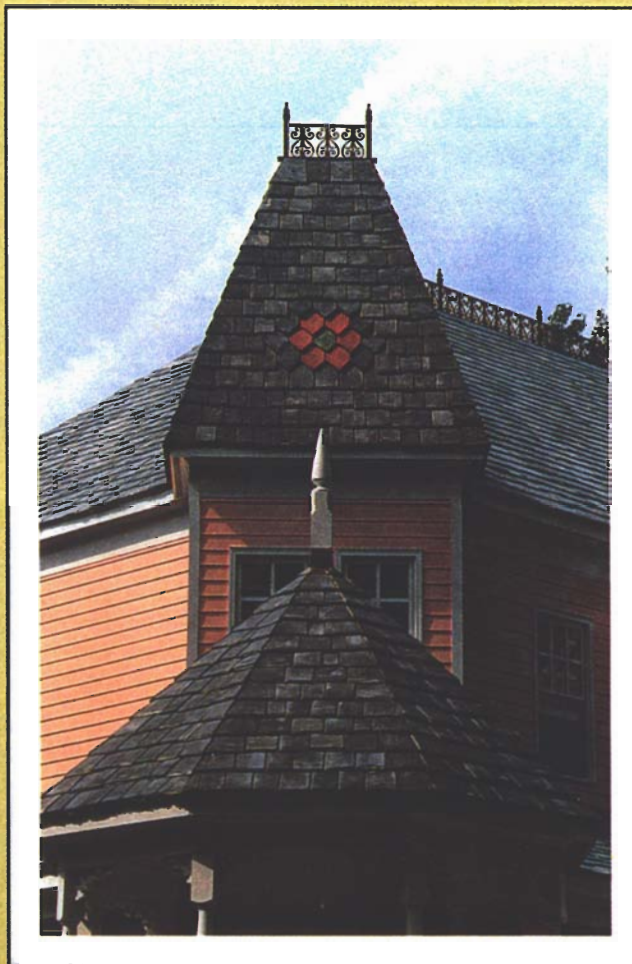
